Major Academic Achievements:

- a. **Massive Open Online Course (MOOC):** The Central University of Haryana developed the first MOOC on “Food Microbiology and Food Safety” (a four-credit course) under the Principal Investigatorship of Prof. R. C. Kuhad, Vice-Chancellor. It has successfully completed its first cycle (from August 2018 to December 2018) with an enrolment of 2771 learners from more than 20 prestigious universities/institutes and food industries. The course was rated as 4.5 out of 5 by the learners. UGC Academic Advisory Council has approved re-run of this course on SWAYAM Portal for the semester January-May 2019. Dr. Tejpal Dhewa is the Course Coordinator of this MOOC.





- b. Establishment of National Resource Centre:** The Ministry of Human Resource Development has identified Central University of Haryana for setting up National Resource Centre for Developing MOOC on “Personal-Emotional Development and Counselling”. The Centre is being set up under Pt. Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT). NRC developed the MOOC for the Annual Refresher Programme in Teaching (ARPIT). The first cycle of training was started from November 1, 2018. Prof. Sarika Sharma, Dean, School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences is the Course Coordinator.

FoSTaC is a participatory programme of training and capacity building, designed to enhance public awareness in





the area of food safety. During the year, the Centre trained 79 students from various disciplines of life sciences as “Food Safety Supervisor (FSS)-Manufacturing”. The trained students will be preferred for employment in food industry.

राजभाषा

Infrastructure

Progress for Augmenting University Infrastructure:

- Construction of Administrative Block and Health Centre** is nearing completion and is expected to be completed shortly.
- Construction of Boys’ and Girls’ Hostels with capacity of 630 students each** are in full swing. One block of each hostel is expected to be completed shortly.
- Construction of Type – V and Type – III staff quarters** is in full swing and expected to be completed by September, 2019.
- Construction of Sedimentation-cum-Storage Tanks** and Water Treatment Plant (WTP) for supply of treated canal water has started.



- e. **Connecting Road** has been constructed upto newly constructed Type –II and Type – IV staff quarters.
- f. **Electric Substation No. 2, 3 and 4** have been commissioned for providing uninterrupted power supply in the University Campus.
- g. **Centralized Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS) system** of capacity 320 KVA has been installed in new Academic Blocks – I, III & IV.
- h. **Modular furniture** has been installed in faculty rooms, offices, class rooms and laboratories of Academic Blocks – I, III & IV.
- i. **Installation of 160 KWp rooftop Solar Power Plant** at Academic Blocks – I, III & IV has been completed and shall be commissioned shortly.
- j. **Rooftop Commercial RO Systems** have been installed in all Academic Blocks as well as Hostel Blocks.
- k. The University has submitted its proposal to MHRD for availing finance from Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA) for construction of one Academic Block, Library Building, Guest House buildings, as well as for procurement of lab equipment and other infrastructure.
